WUCWO's organisations are to hold the Regional Conference for Latin America and the Caribbean in Guatemala from 26 to 29 October. There has been a great deal of preparatory work by the Board members, led by the Vice-President of the Region together with the Asociación of Damas Católicas of Guatemala. This conference was also announced through Vatican Radio, and the President and the Secretary met with the Consul and First Secretary of the Embassy of Guatemala to the Holy See, Adelina Viteri de Bruno, who enthusiastically welcomed this Conference.

## Right to drinking water and sanitary services



Daniela Castella, our international representative, participated on behalf of WUCWO in the side event organised by the Permanent Mission of the Holy See to the UN in Geneva on this subject, whose key conference was given by Cardinal Peter Turkson.

At the grassroots level, several of our organisations are working for this right, addressed in one of WUCWO's resolutions for the period 2014-2018. A new drinking water well is being built in a rural school in one of the poorest areas of Argentina, where Misiones Rurales Argentinas carries out its actions, with funds collected in various regions of the world, which will allow children and teachers to quench their thirst, have dignified sanitary services, wash their utensils and irrigate their vegetable garden.

## Action Catholique des Femmes, France: "THEY ARE WOMEN AND THEY ARE ALONE"



Even though media are now more important than ever, in France many people are affected by different forms of loneliness, which can cause pain and distress. Five million people are isolated; they were four million in 2010. This affects all ages and social situations. The Action Catholique des Femmes has launched the project of a photographic exhibition to warn about this difficult reality. It wants to be the spokesperson for those who experience loneliness, which can often disrupt their lives.

## Celebration of the WUCWO Day in Australia



Last May, different branches of the Catholic Women's League of Australia celebrated the 2017 WUCWO Day, whose title was "Suffering women in the world". Both in Queensland and New South Wales events, a message from WUCWO General President, Maria Giovanna Ruggieri, was read.

The CWL Queensland celebrated it with Masses and liturgies in all areas of Queensland and a collection of money that was later sent to the Archdiocese.

The CWL New South Wales offered Masses in many places, sometimes using the Liturgy by the Latin America and Caribbean Region. Some of the themes addressed were maternal health and well-being of women, prevention of abuse, promotion of dignity and equal rights, and social justice. A generous donation was forwarded to the CWLA National Treasurer.

## Annual Convention of the Catholic Women's League of Canada



The Catholic Women's League of Canada celebrated in Charlottetown, August 6 – 9<sup>th</sup>, its 97<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention. From the opening Mass to the closing gala banquet, over 900 members from across Canada gathered in prayer, in social activities, and in plenary sessions. A number of speakers were featured throughout the days, reports were presented, and resolutions were accepted. Delegates at the convention were joined online by members across the country to help formulate a strategy to take the League into the next century.
