## The Union of Catholic Mothers England (UCM)



The UCM members have lobbied their Members of the Parliament (MPs) to vote against a Bill that was being brought before Parliament. The Bill would have brought in a law that would enable doctors to give assistance to critically ill patients who wanted to commit suicide. Attendance of MPs at the session when the debate took place was unprecedented but there was a strong majority against

the Bill. We hope that successful lobbying will inspire others to further engage in public debates which affect the well-being of all God's creation.

## Mary's Woods, Philippines



The members of the Catholic Women's League of Philippines take care of land donated to them and have planted many trees, flowers and plants in order to have a peaceful nook where anyone can go and take time to rest, known as Mary's Woods. **The project was envisioned as one of a nationwide reforestation and beautification** and has since been replicated all across the country from
